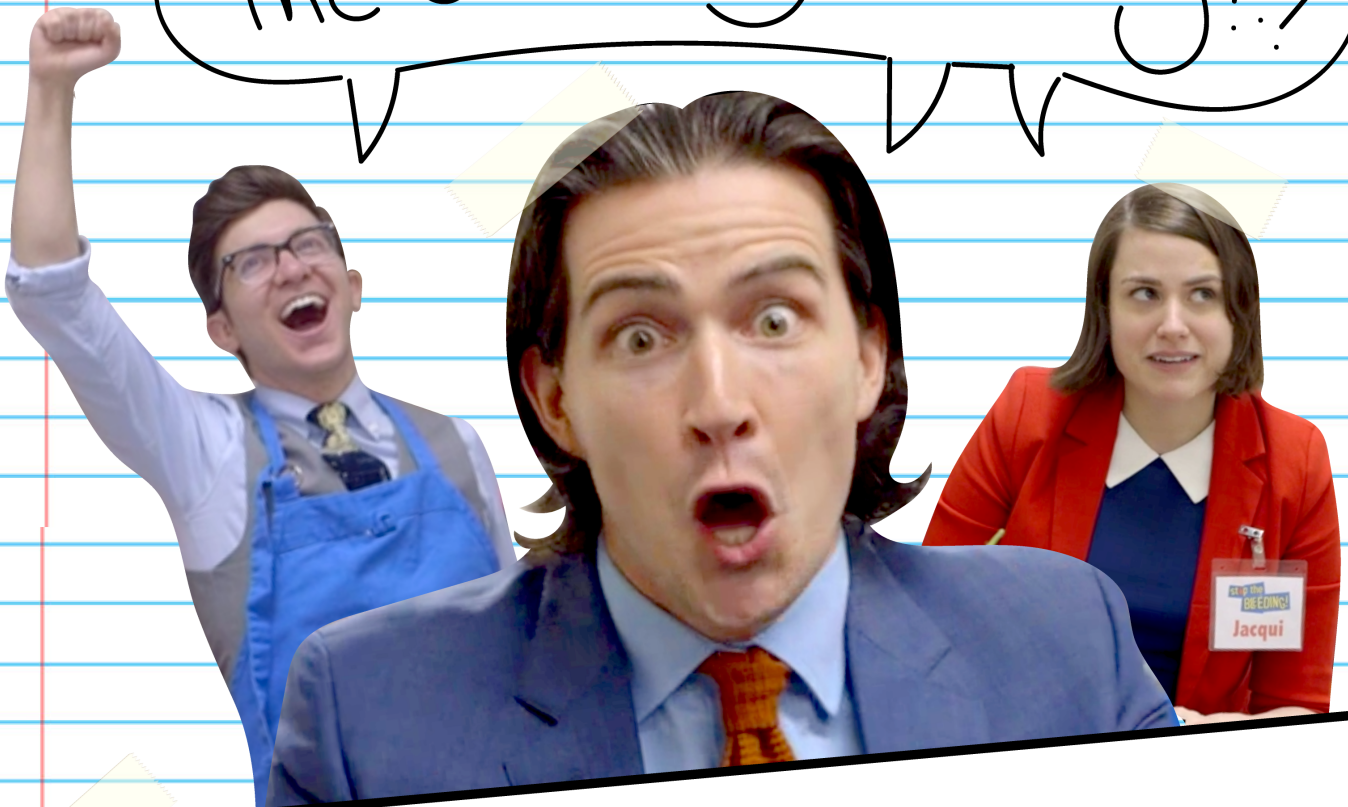

Spanish-speaking community members with bleeding disorders tell Ace that there has been no one there to translate for them or make them feel welcome. Have you ever felt underrepresented or left out? If so, how?
